## The Points System

POINTS TO WIN

Twelve matches are played over three days, four each day. Points rise as the weekend goes on, so Sunday is worth the most and the Cup often swings late. There are 24 points in all, and the first team to 13 lifts the trophy.

## Weekend Schedule

| DAY              | MATCHES               | POINTS EACH |
|------------------|-----------------------|-------------|
| Friday, Sep 25   | 4 (singles & doubles) | 1           |
| Saturday, Sep 26 | 4 (singles & doubles) | 2           |
| Sunday, Sep 27   | 4 (singles & doubles) | 3           |

## How the Teams Work

- Six players per team: Team Europe, captained by Yannick Noah, against Team World, captained by Andre Agassi.
- The three highest-ranked players from each region qualify automatically; the captain adds three more as Captain's Picks.
- Every player must play at least one singles match over the first two days, and no player can play more than two singles all weekend.
- At least four players from each team must feature in doubles, and no doubles pairing is repeated unless the Decider is needed.

## How to Use This Scorecard

- Fill in both six-player rosters once the captains name their squads.
- Log each match on page one, mark the winning team, and tally the running score after every result.
- Remember the point jump each day: a 2-point Saturday and 3-point Sunday can erase a Friday lead in a hurry.
